Every ten years, when the US Census releases population data, school boards must review their member districts to ensure there is an equitable population balance between the individual districts.

We had Sammamish Data Systems, an uninvolved third party, review the new census data and make recommendations for some minor changes to the boundaries. This same company completed this work after the 2010 census.

Sammamish Data feels the attached plan meets the requirements of RCW 29A.76.010 including:

Districts are equal in population as possible, contiguous, compact, no disfavoring any groups/parties, and protecting Areas of Common Interest.

Recommendation:

We recommend the board review the plan and <u>make any suggested changes or</u> direct the administration to move forward and bring to a future board meeting for public comments and adoption by resolution.


We will also be providing a Dept of Justice interchange files. These are a file for your County's GIS department. This is to allow them to create 'Shape' files.
